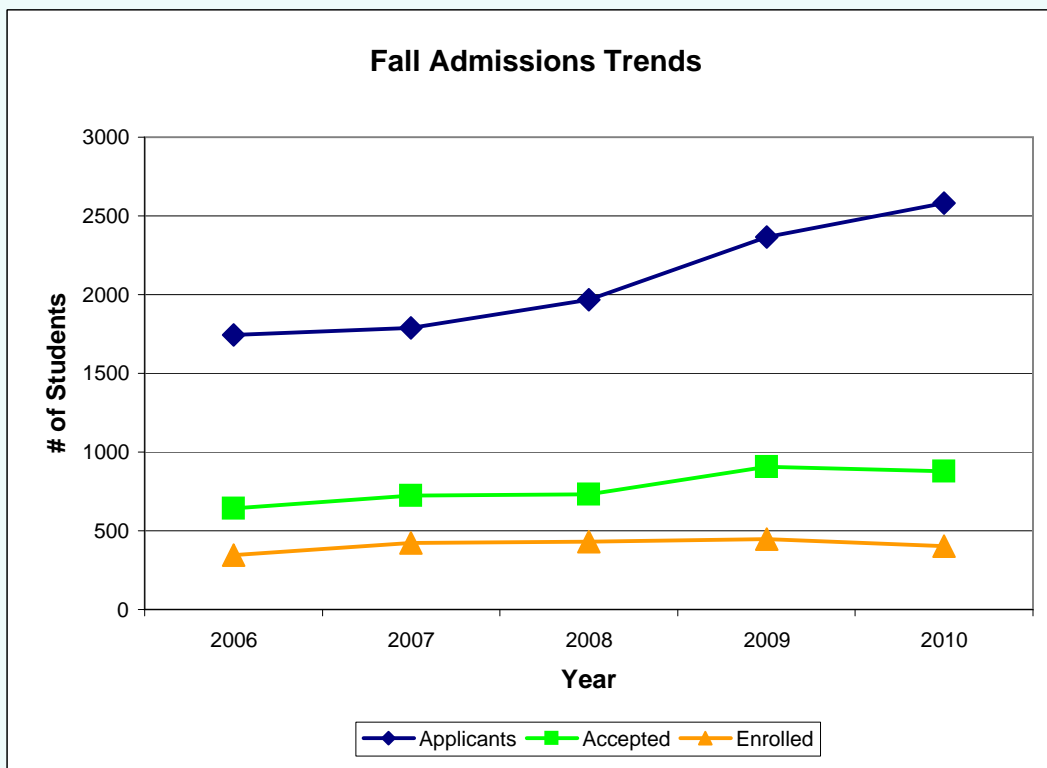

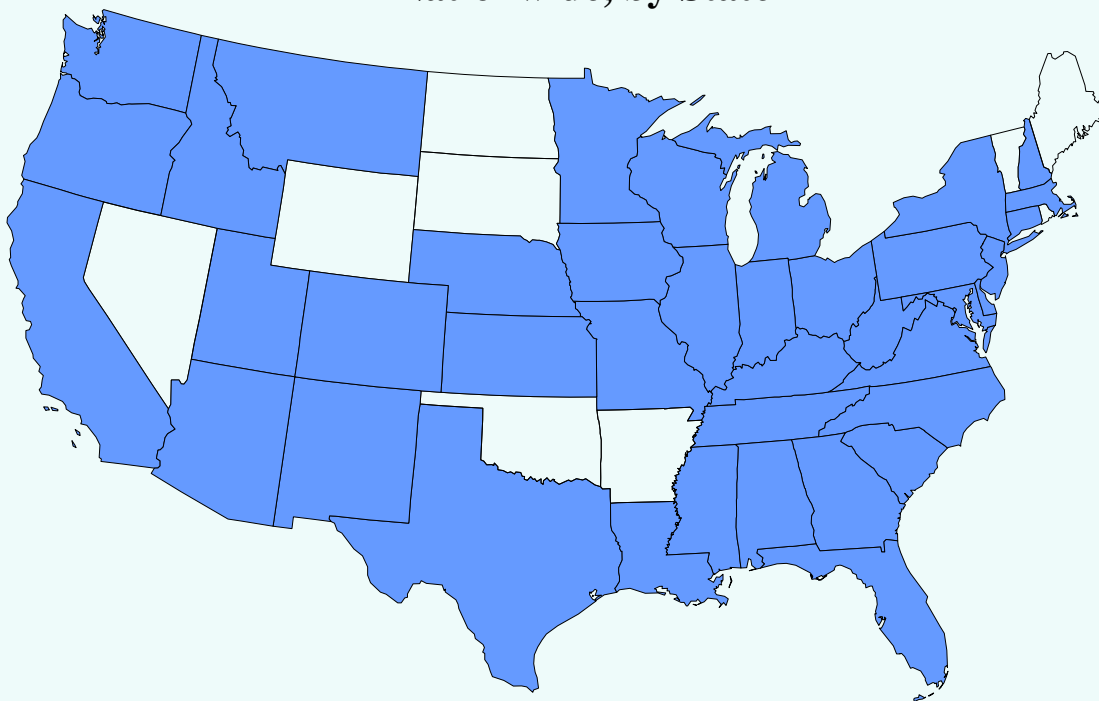

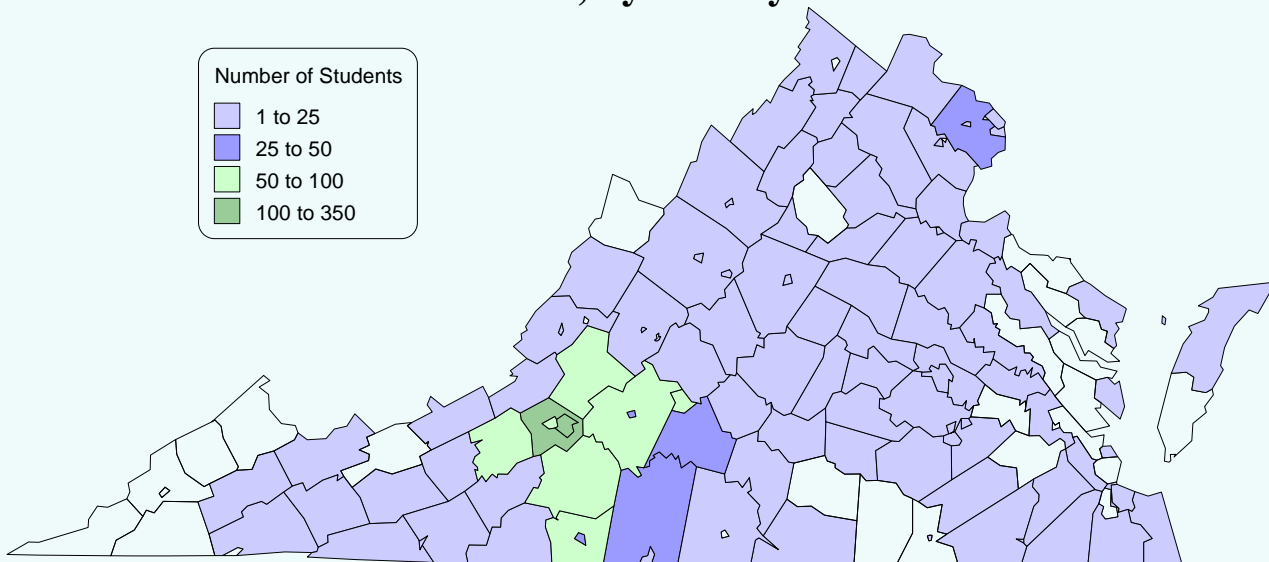

Nationwide, by State

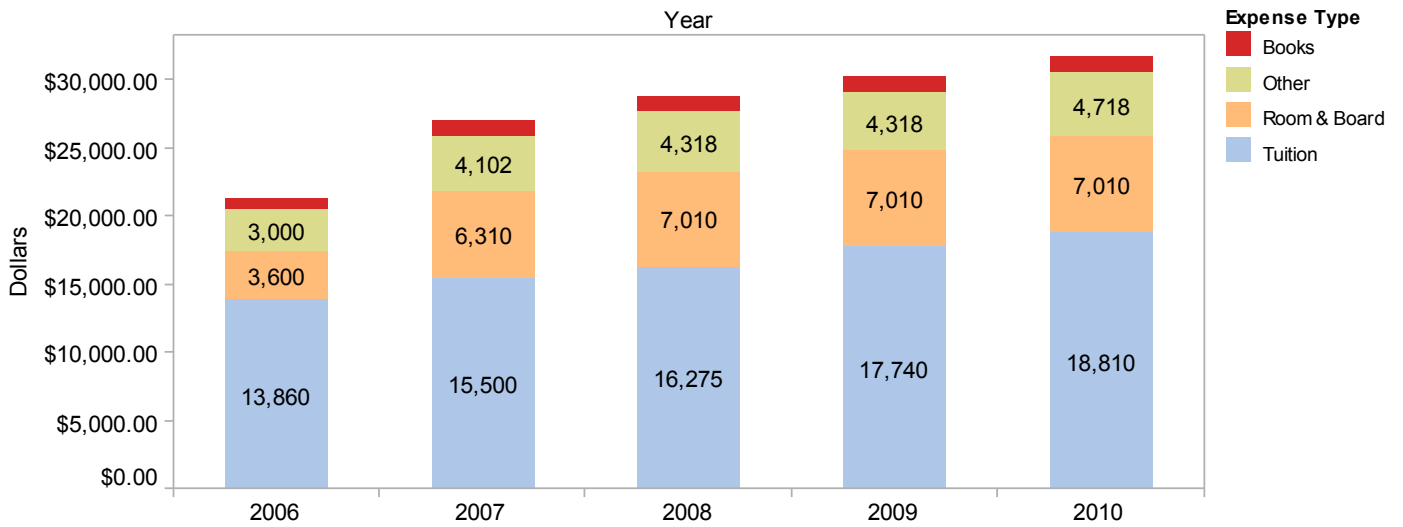


Within VA, by County



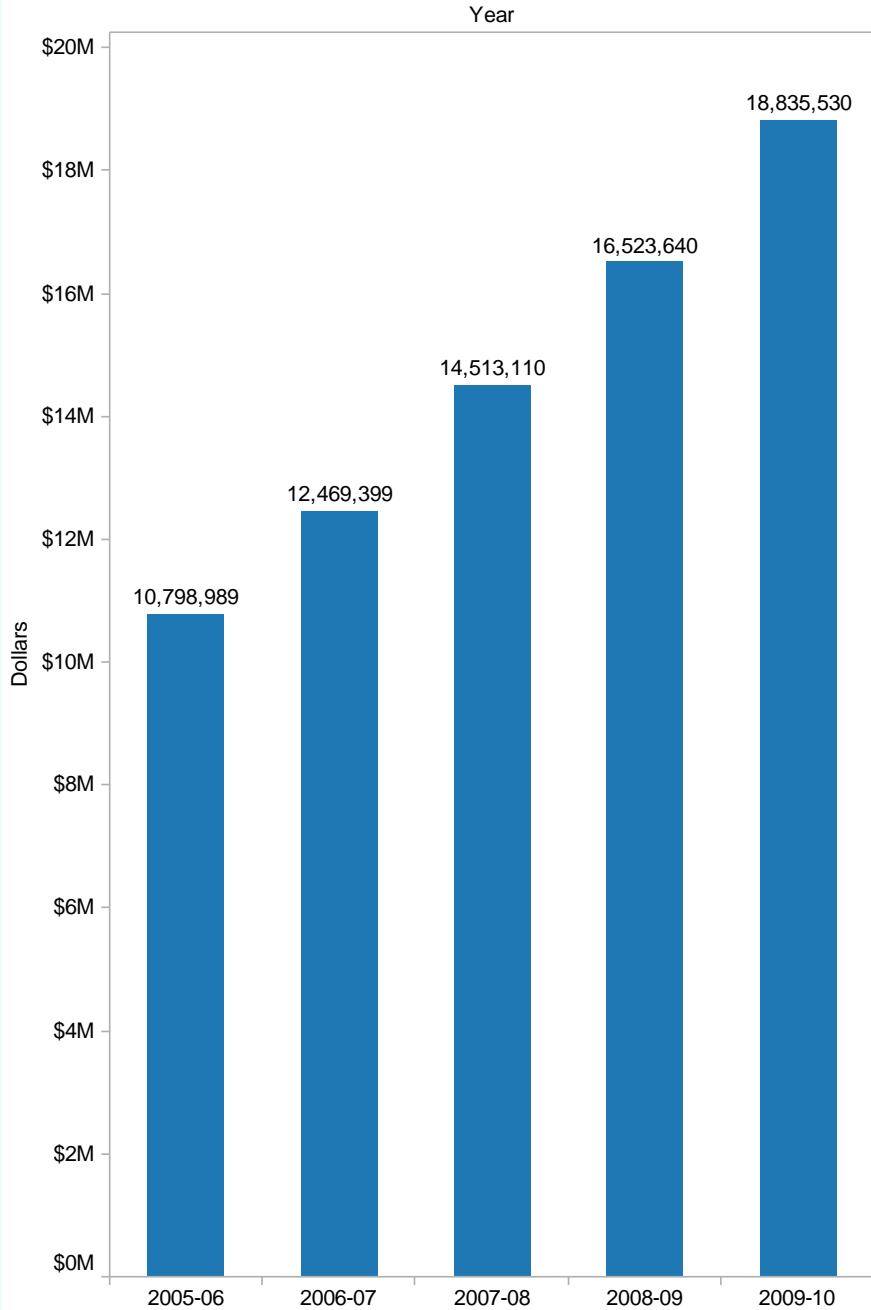

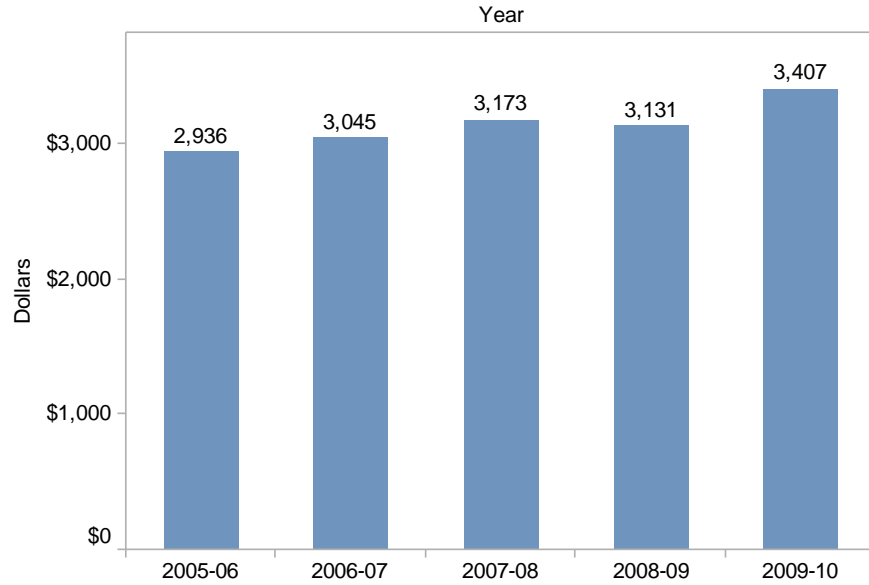

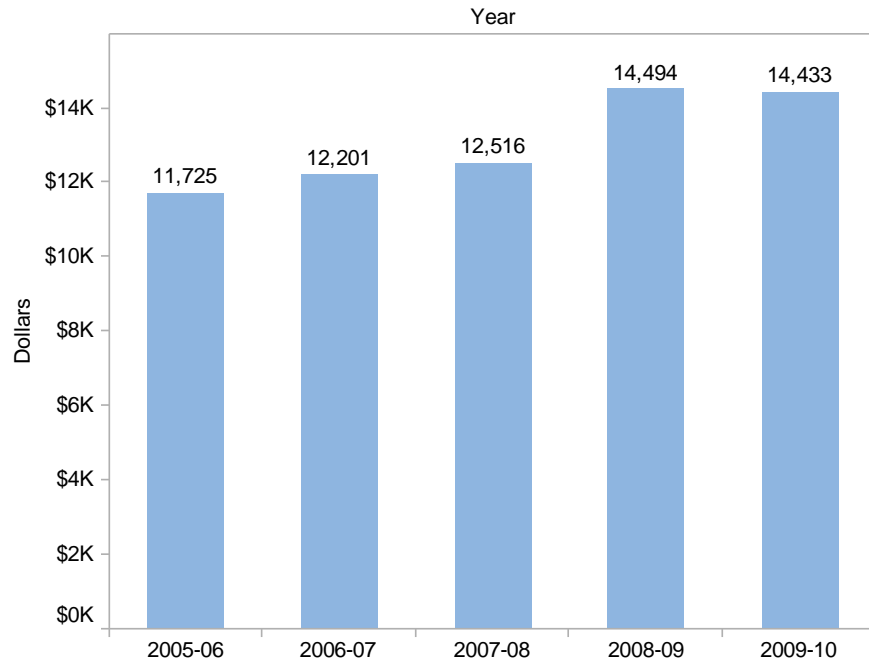
Total Financial Aid Received by Students

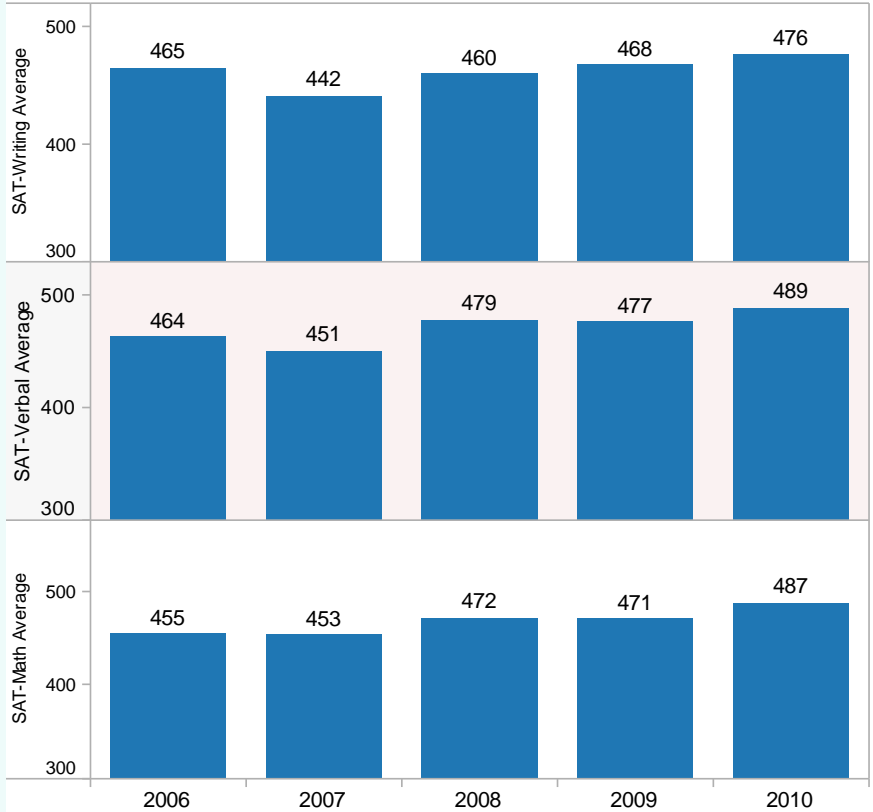
Entering First-Time UG's - Avg. HSGPA



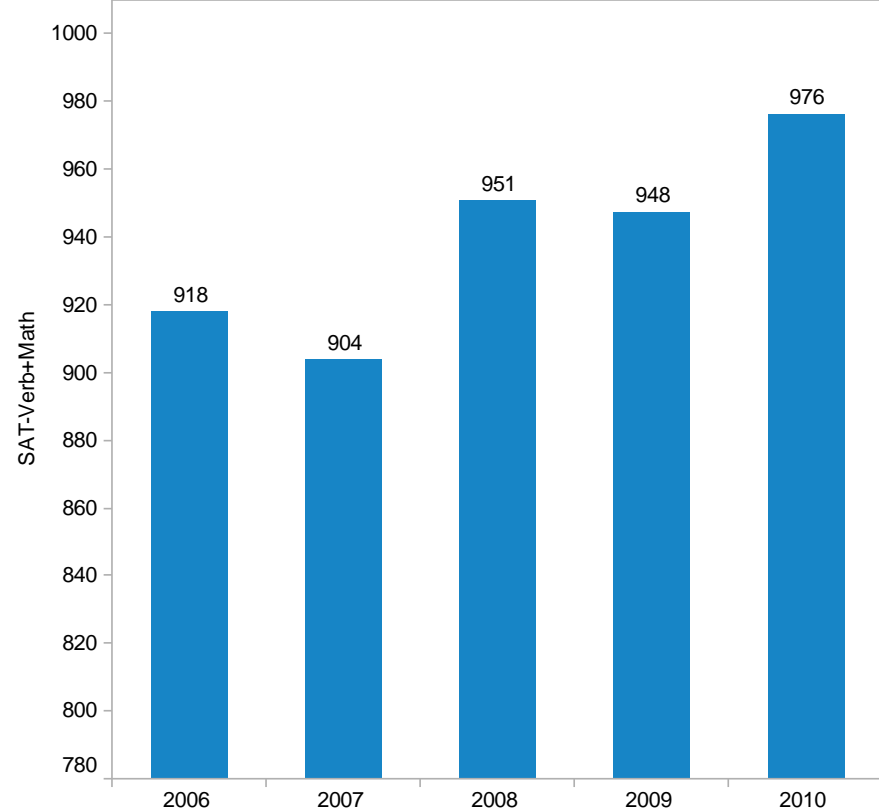
Entering Transfer UG's - Avg. Transfer GPA



Entering First-Time UG's - Avg. SAT Scores

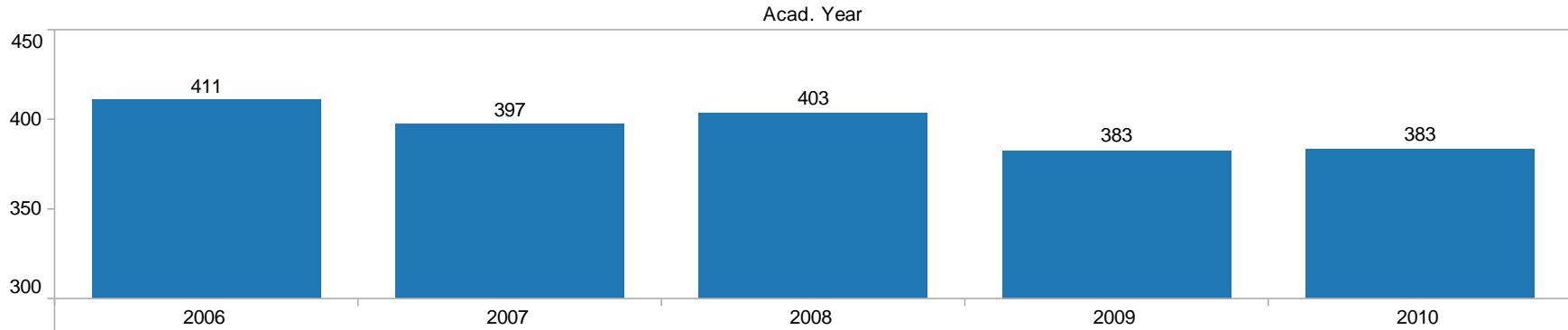


Entering First-Time UG's - Average SAT-Verbal+Math Scores

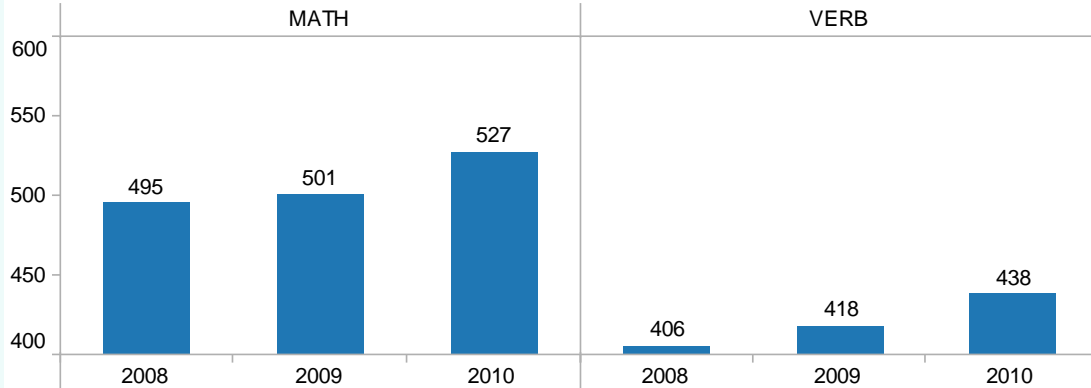


Graduate Programs - Average Scores for Entering Students

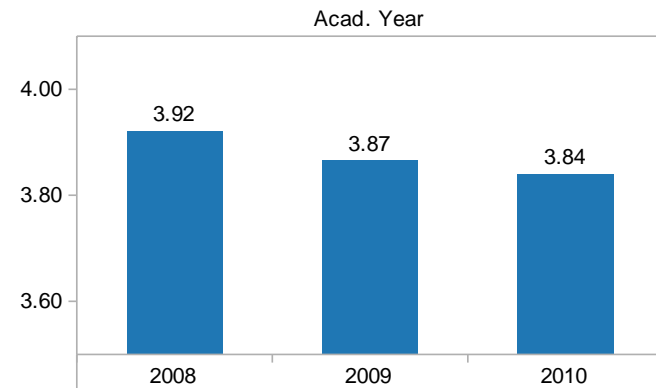

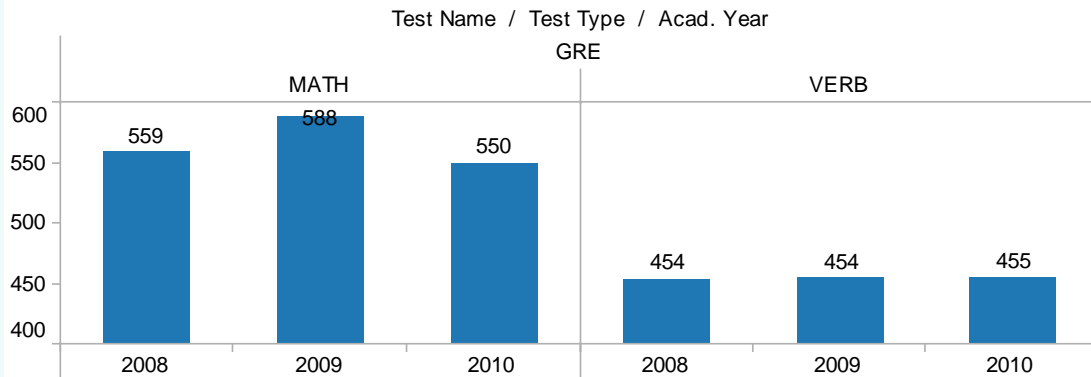
**Average GRE Scores for Entering Students
Master's of Science in Occupational Therapy Program**



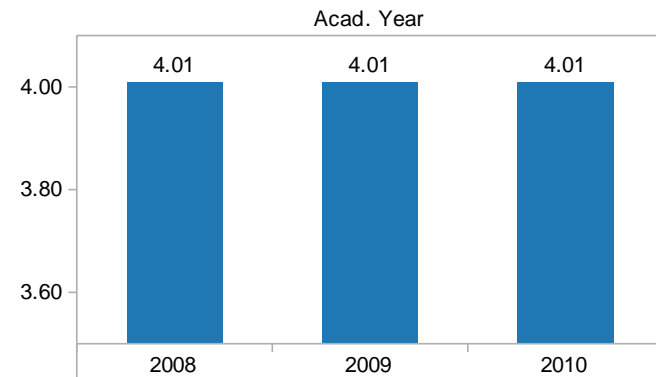
**Average Analytical GRE Score for Entering Students

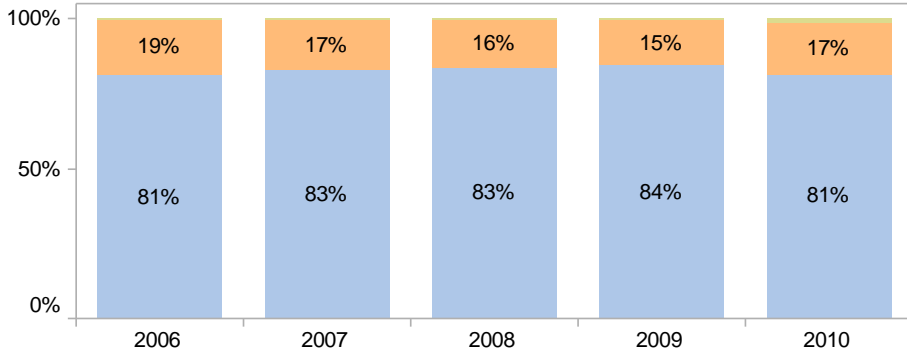

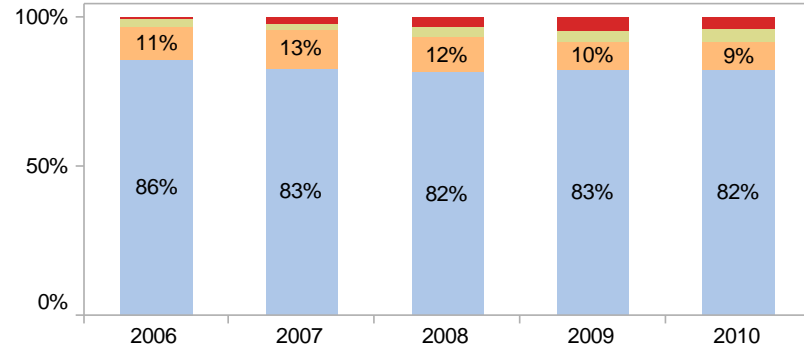
% of Total Enrollment by Gender

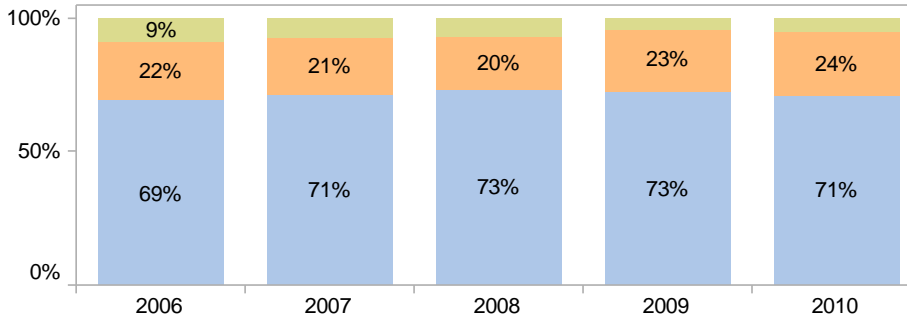

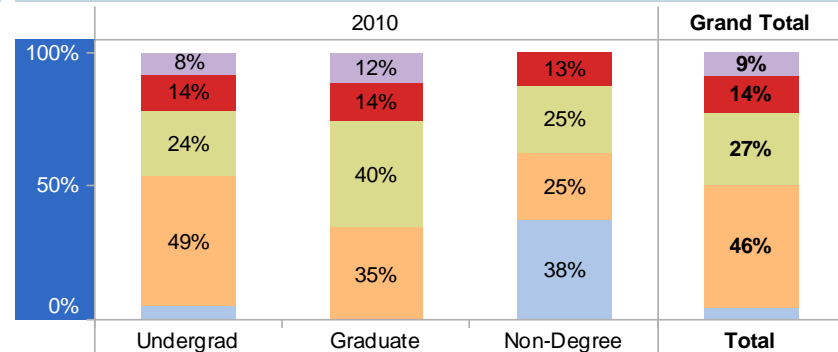

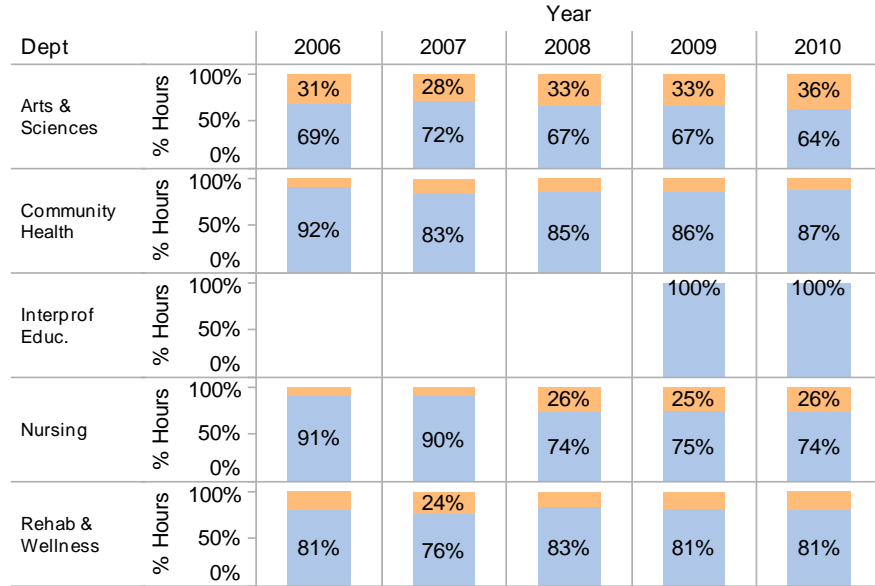
Fall Course Hours by Type

Distance Credits as a Percent of Total Student Credit Hours

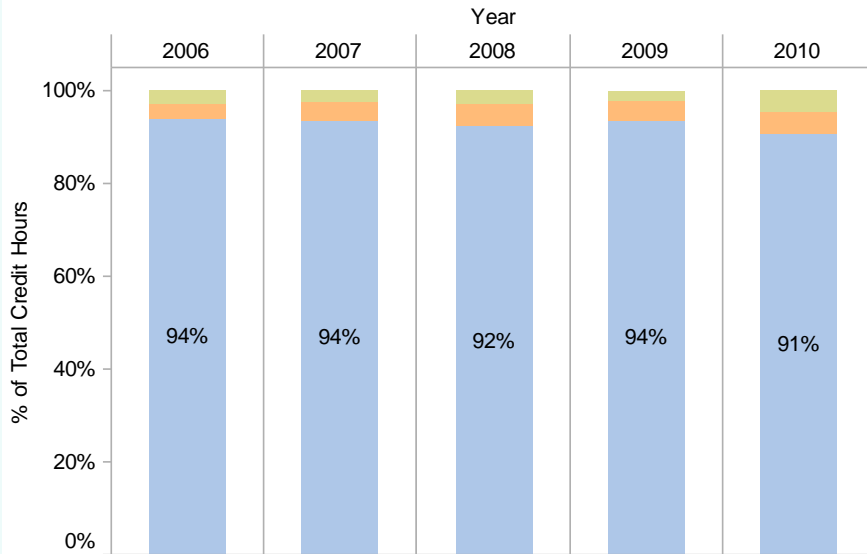

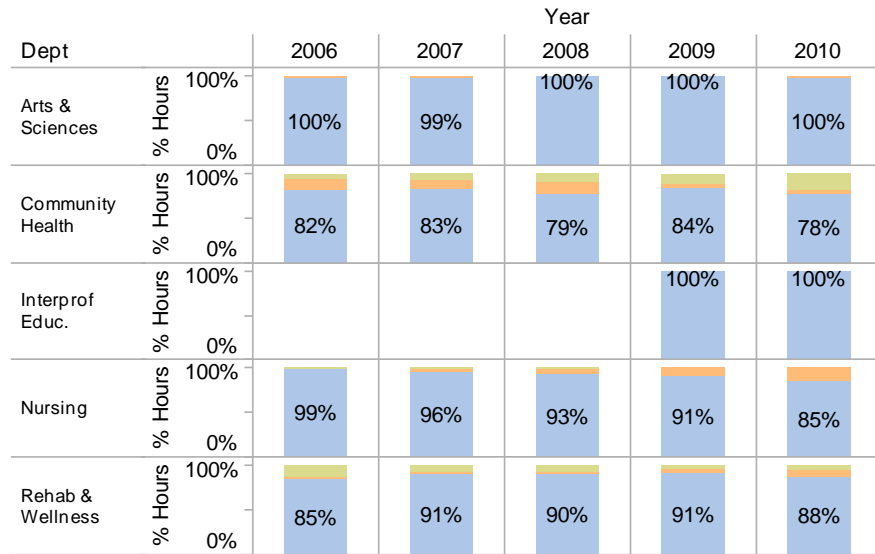


% of Fall Course Hours by Course Type

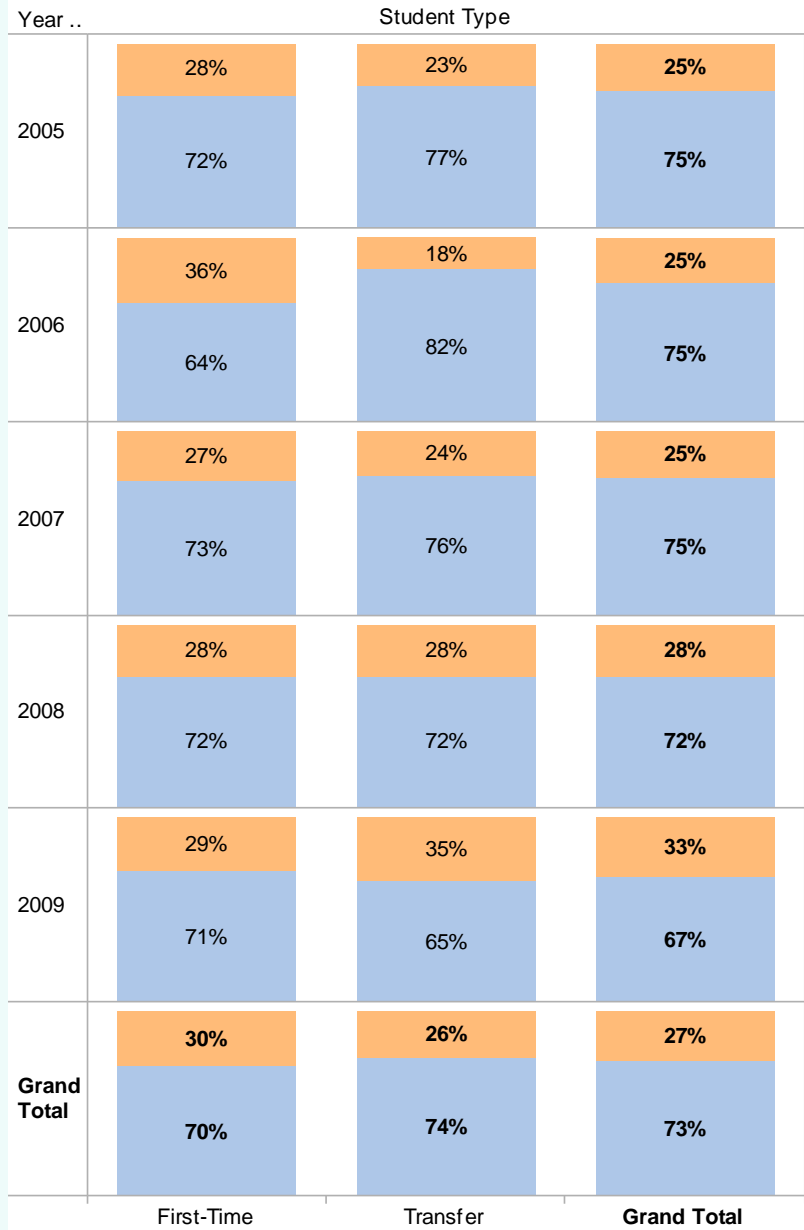

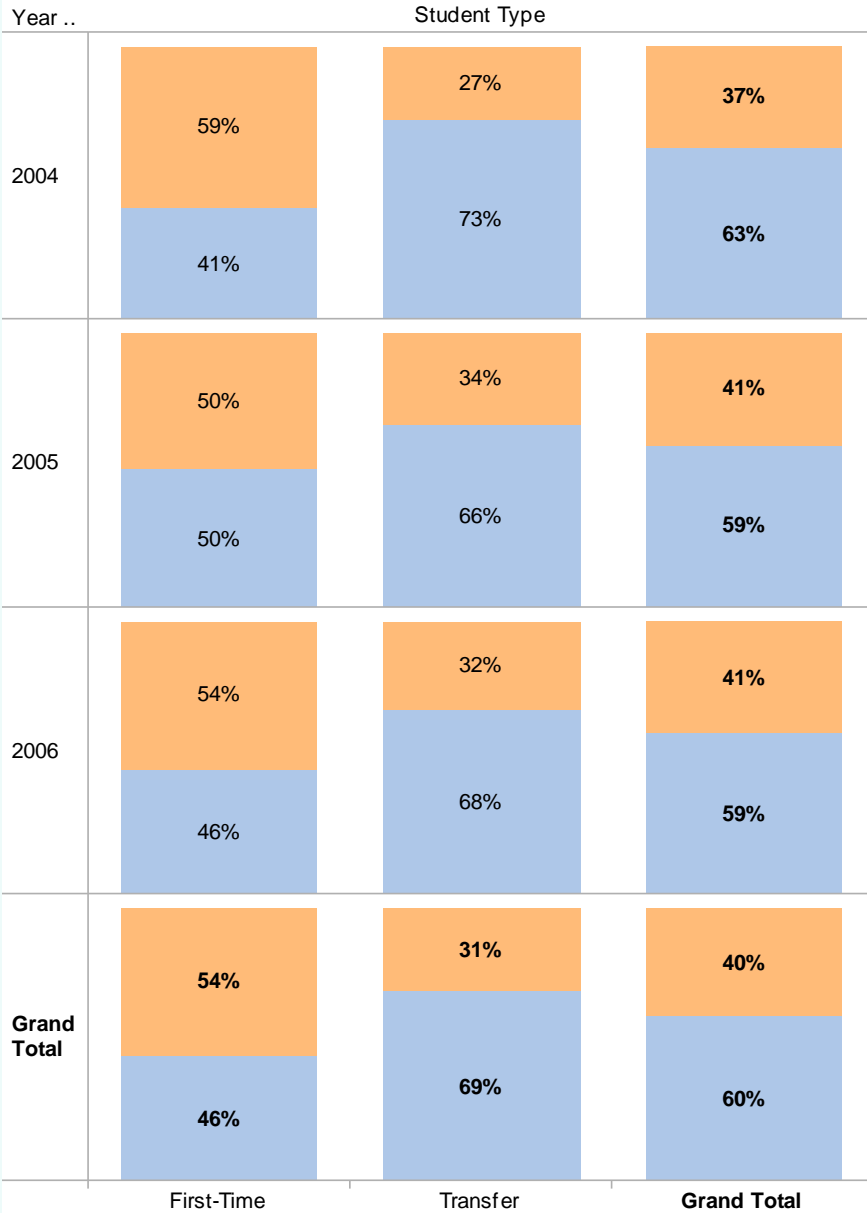

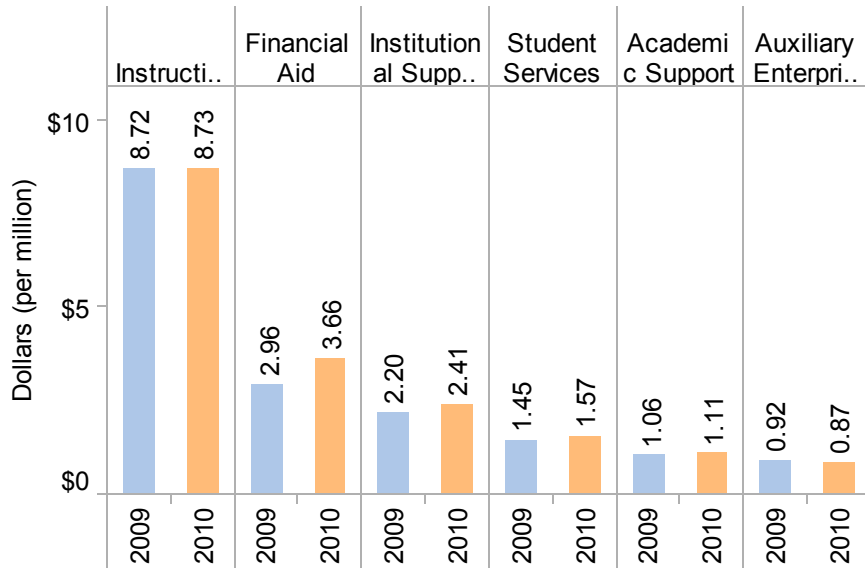
Revenue Comparison



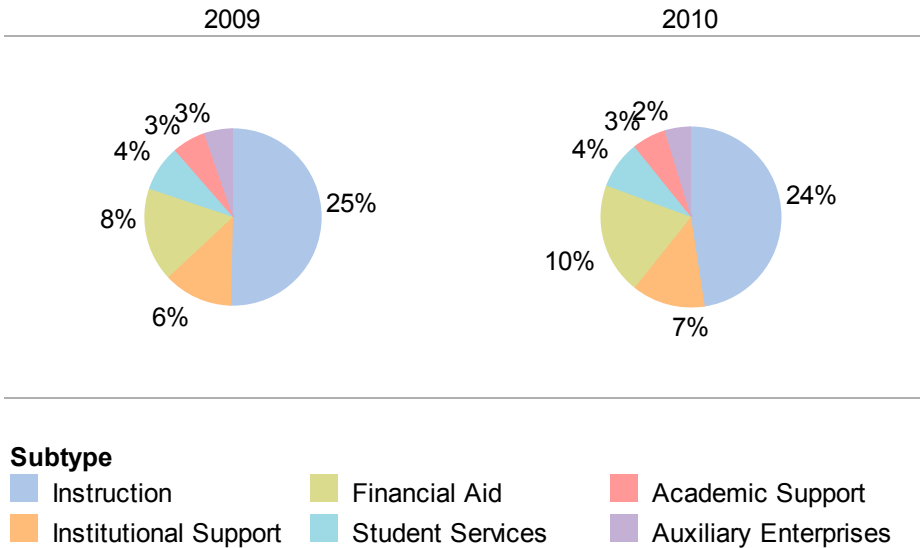
Expenses per FTE

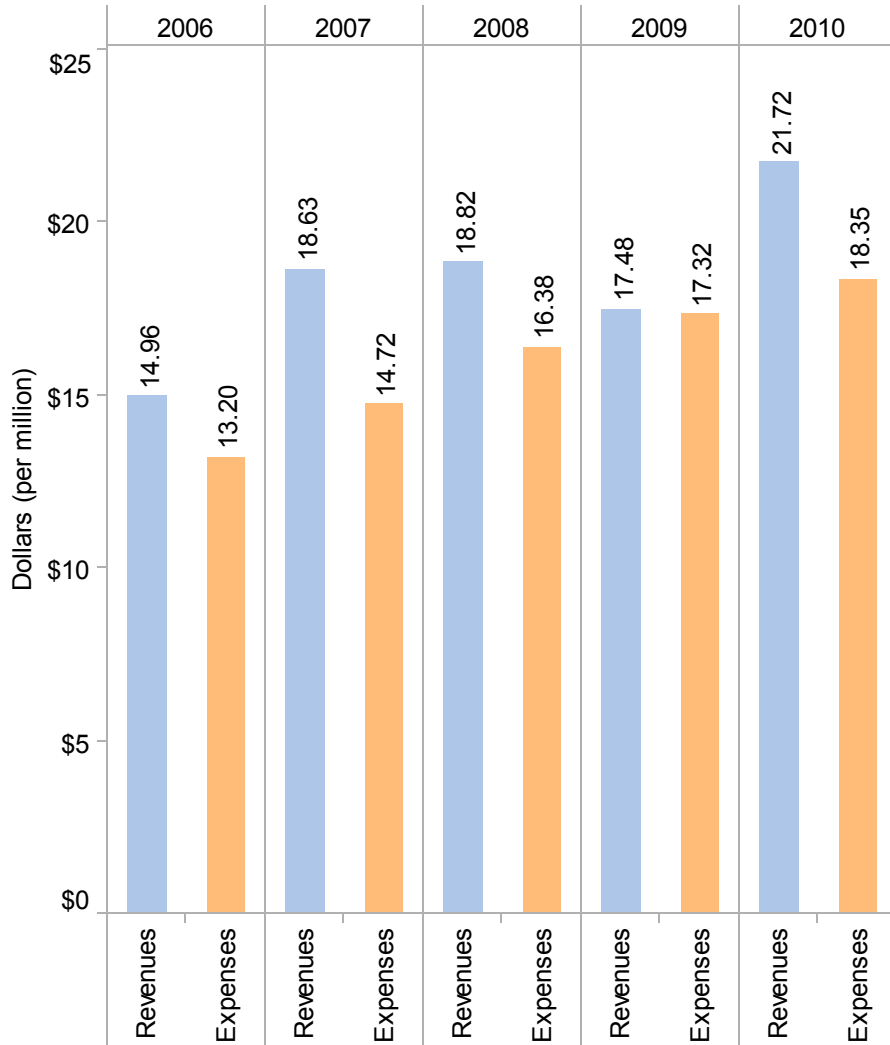

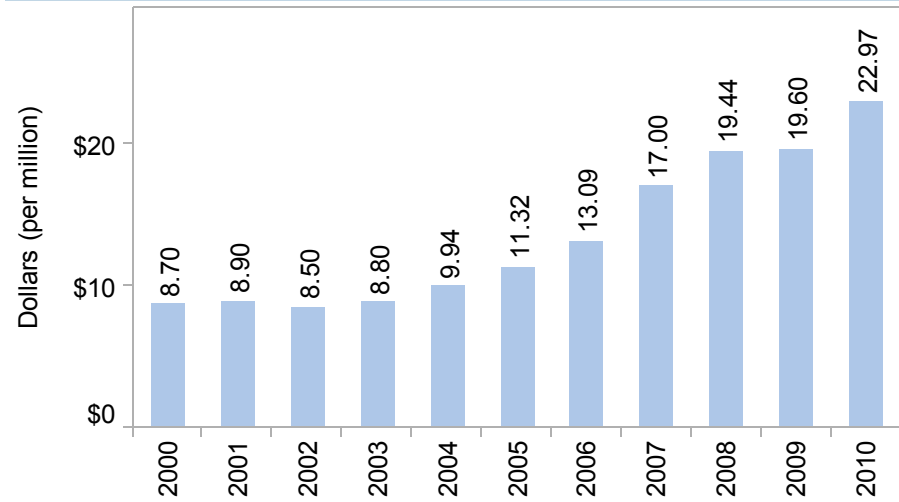

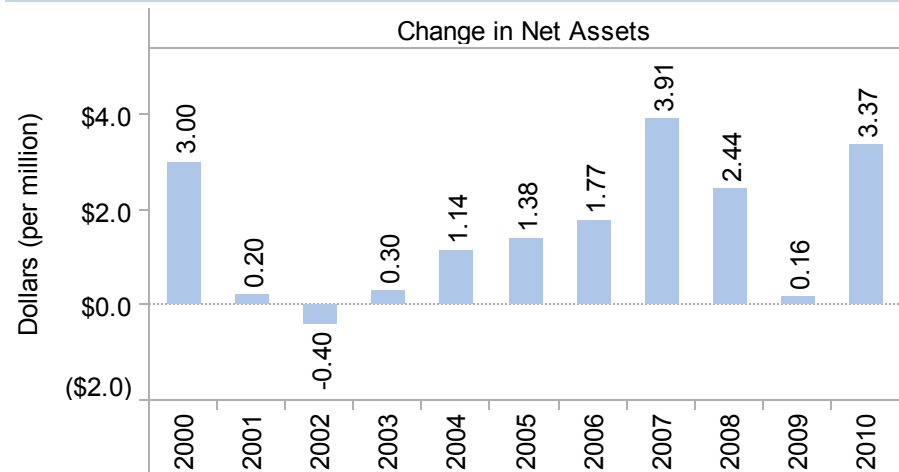

Net Assets - Trends Across Time

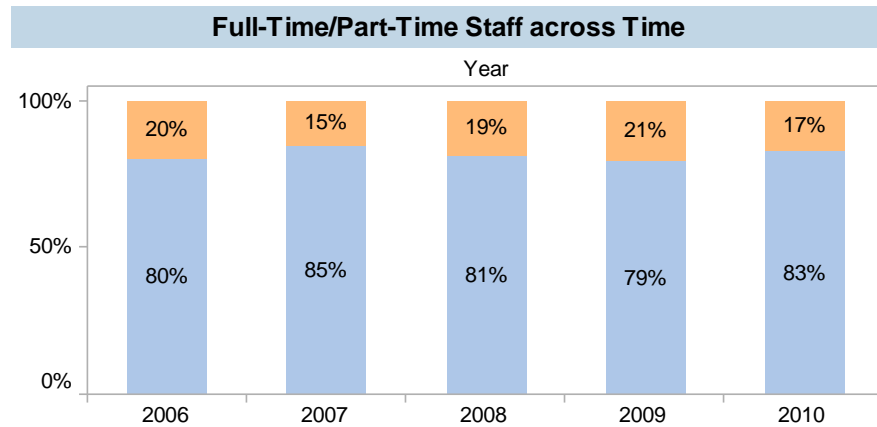
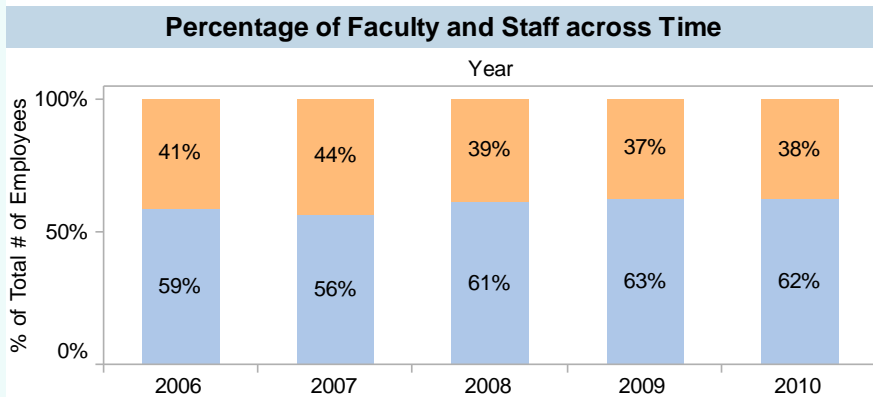
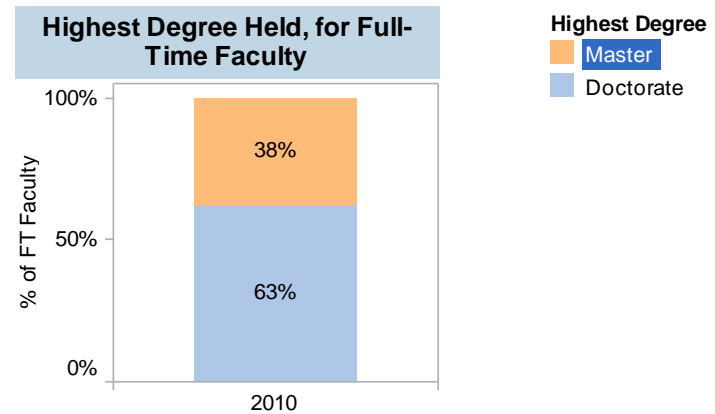
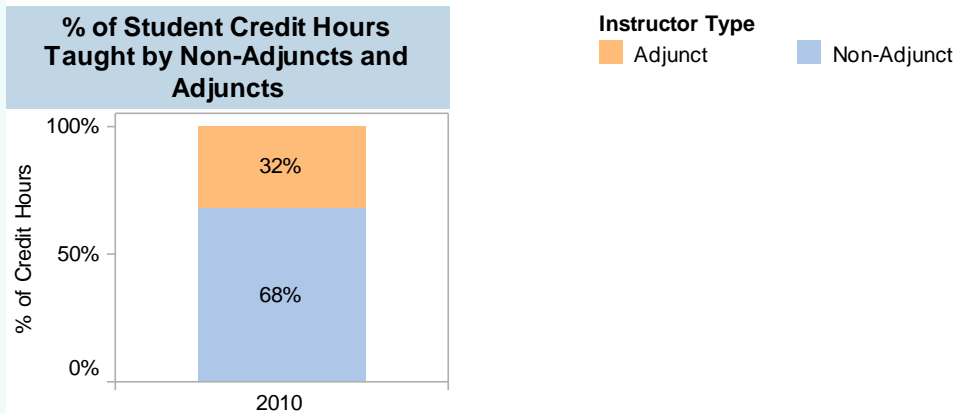
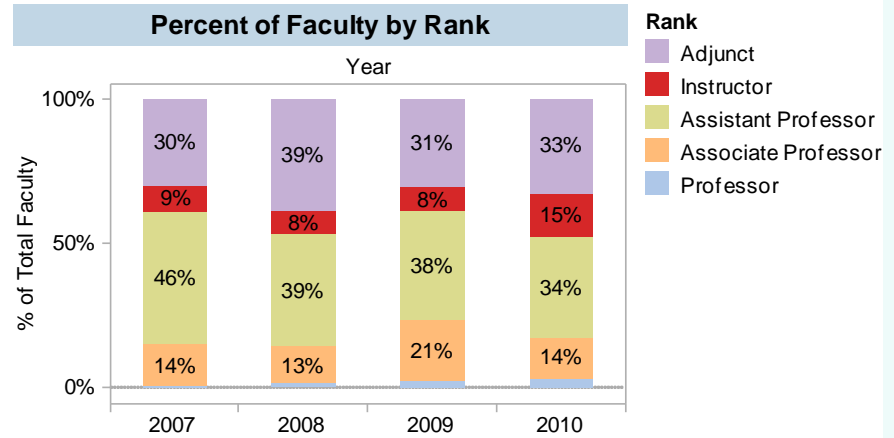

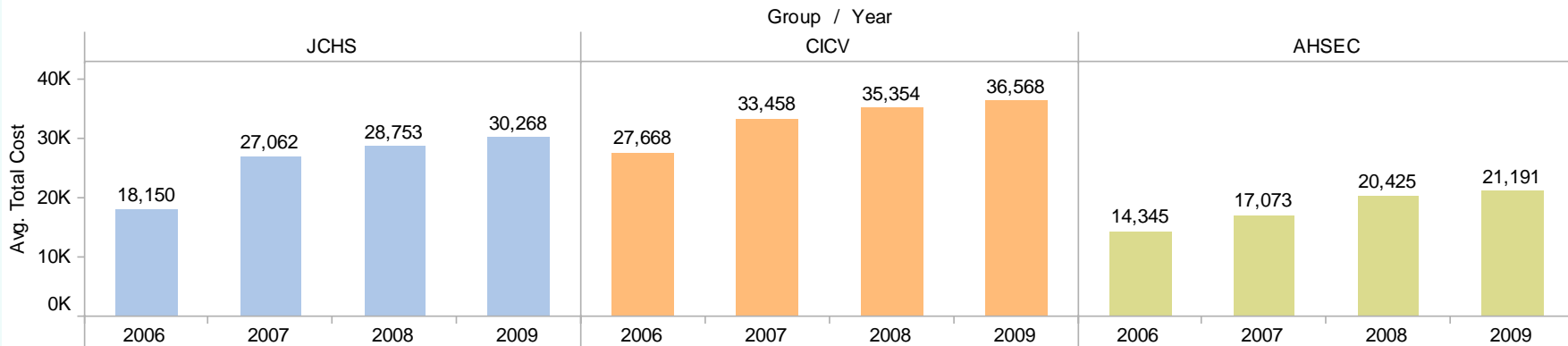

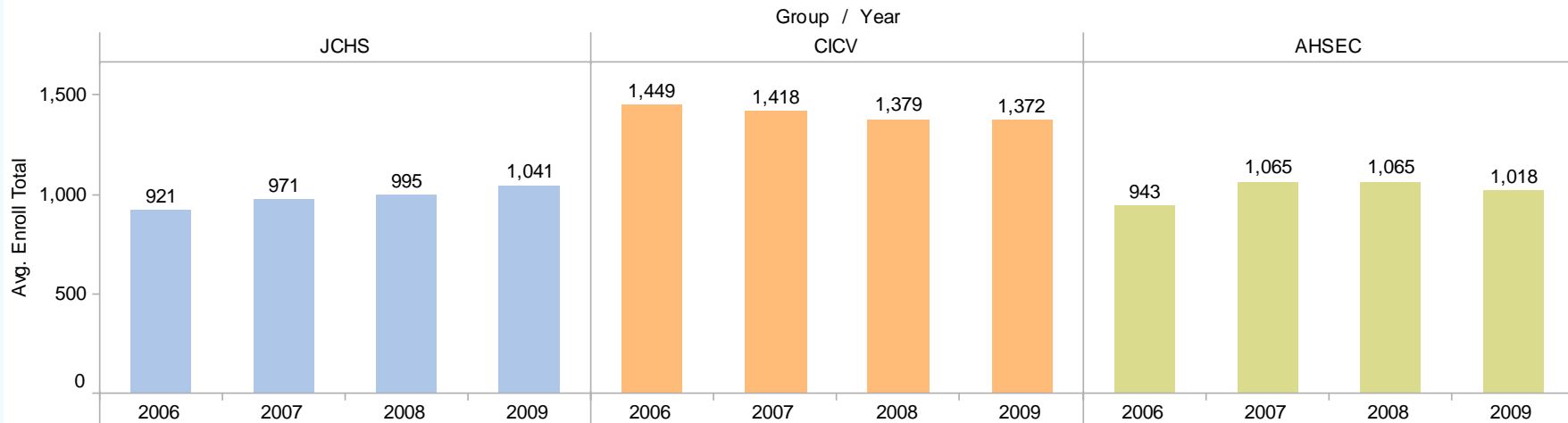

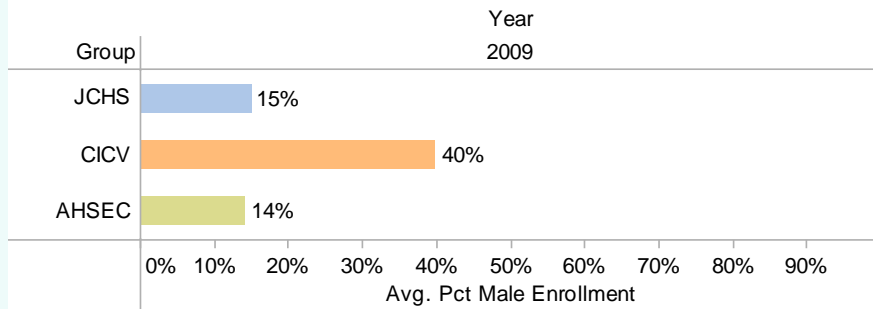
Total Enrollment Comparison Fall Semester



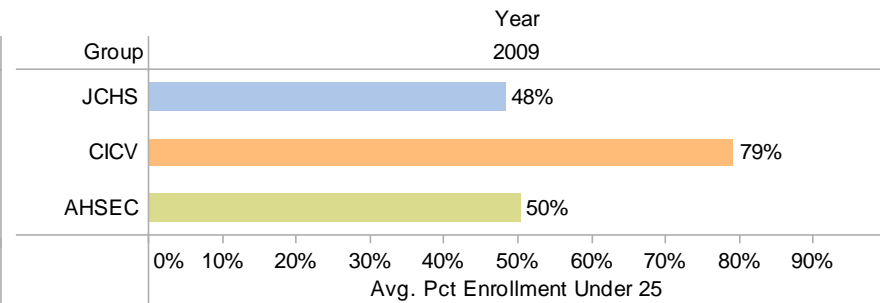

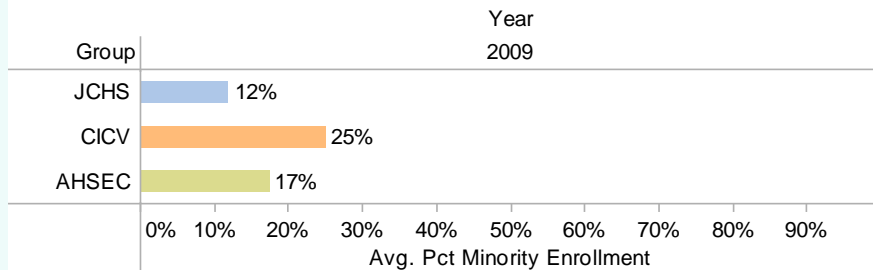
% Male Enrollment



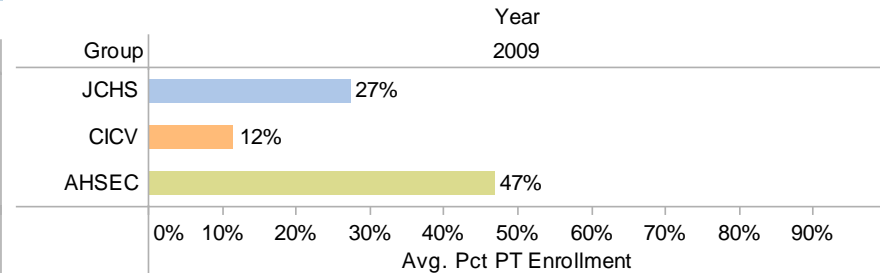
% Enrollment Under 25



% Minority Enrollment

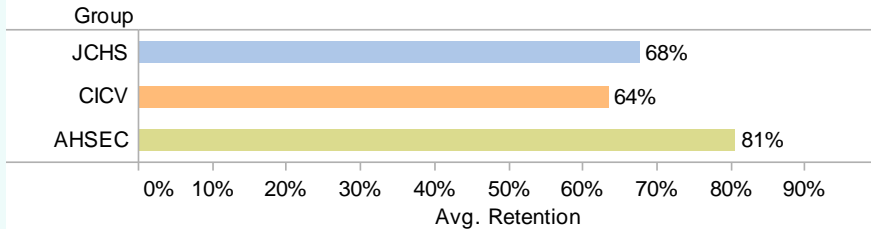


% Part-Time Enrollment



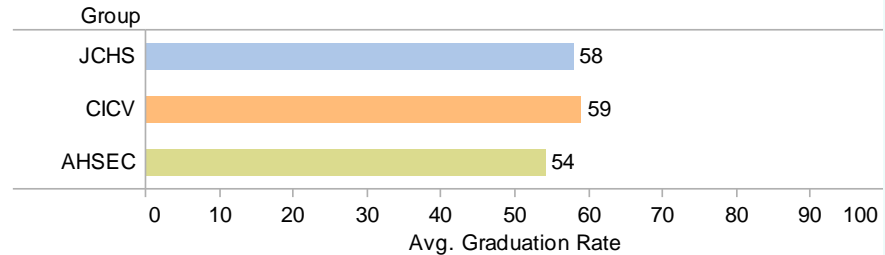

Comparison of Average One-Year Retention for Prior Cohort



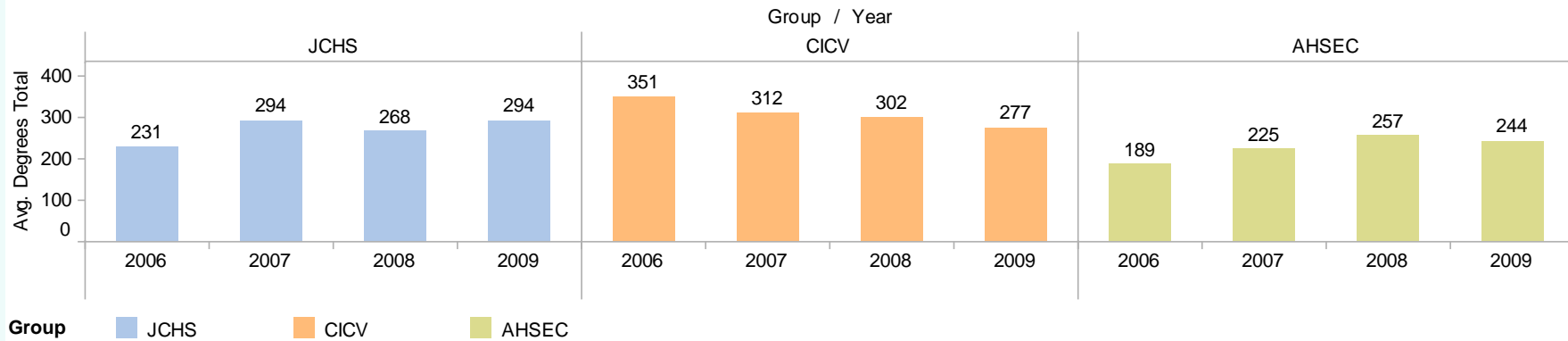
