IV. Prerequisites: HCM 375

V. Course Description:

Students are provided with pre-professional experiential learning. The preceptor ensures hours are obtained in the required domains of practice. Projects are approved by HCM faculty and supervised by the preceptor onsite. Completion of the required hours will allow examination for board licensure as a Nursing Home Administrator.

VI. Course Objectives:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will

1. Differentiate post-acute care, services, and delivery systems for these services.
2. Evaluate types of service providers, patients, and reimbursement systems.
3. Analyze the impact chronic illness is having on the long-term care system.
4. Examine cultural diversity of patients and employees.
5. Evaluate the unique management issues surrounding long-term care service delivery.
